NOP Proposes Amendments to the National List

July 14th the NOP published their proposed amendments to the National List 7 CFR Part 205. The proposed amendments would extend the allowance for the use of Methionine in Livestock feed until October 1, 2010. Comments on the proposed amendments should be submitted to the NOP by August 13, 2008. Instructions for submitting comments are available in reading the [full proposed amendment](#).

NOP Proposes Reaffirming Allowance of 11 Sunset National List Items

In an additional amendment proposal the the NOP, on July 14th reaffirmed the continued allowance of 11 sunset items in 7 CFR Part 205, commonly known as the National list. The proposal includes many items currently in use on organic farms and in organic handling facilities. Of note is the proposed change to add and annotation and clarify Tartaric Acids addition to both 205.605 (a) and (b). The listing of tartaric acid is proposed to be annotated with the requirement that it is produced from either (a) grape wine or (b) malic acid.
