Deadline for Comments on Pasture Rule Change Approaching!

The deadline for submission of comments to the proposed pasture rule are due December 23rd, 2008. As the 60 day comment period comes to a close it is imperative that you review the proposed changes and submit your comments in order for the NOP to adjust the final rule accordingly and make it functional to all producers. Get Your 606 Ingredients Listed!

Do you sell certified organic ingredients that are listed on 205.606? Items such as colors, gums, hops, starches or lecithin? If you currently carry and sale these products in certified organic form then consider having them listed on www.606organic.com. This new website now being hosted by the [Accredited Certifiers Association](#) is working to create a resource and verification site that both the industry and certifiers can use in checking for commercial availability of these ingredients. The USDA regulations currently require that any agricultural ingredient used in and "organic" labeled product be organic - unless that product is listed on 205.606 and not commercially available. Canada Organic Regulation Update

The Canadian Organic Program remains scheduled to become effective June 30, 2009. We encourage our clients to be patient as we are still waiting for publication of the Final Organic Rule and related policies. Delayed following Canadian elections, we expect the final rule to be different enough from the 2006 Draft Standard that making changes to your Organic System Plan now would be premature. Canadian authorities have recently released a draft proposal to address transition to the new standards and equivalency between US produced products. It is likely there will be plenty of time for producers to implement changes. Oregon Tilth remains on track to be accredited in Canada. We will amend our application and inspection forms for optional certification to the Canadian Program as soon as final regulations are released. Aquaculture Recommendations Passed by NOSB

At their November meeting, the [National Organic Standards Board](#) passed two final recommendations to be added to their previous Aquaculture Recommendations. The first concerns the use of Fish Meal and Fish Oil in feed. The Board recommended that fish meal and oil collected from trimmings of sustainably caught wild fish can be used in organic fish diets. The recommendation sets limits on the source and inclusion rates including a 12 year phase out. The second recommendation pertains to the use of open water net pens and addresses siting, species selection, disease management and environmental impact. These recommendations go to the National Organic Program who will begin the rule making process which is expected to take at least three years.

At the November NOSB meeting in Washington DC, Barbara Robinson, Acting Director of the National Organic Program provided an update of NOP activities including:

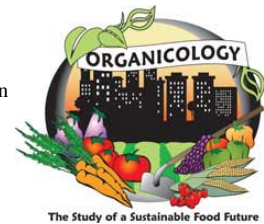
- the hiring of 6 staff since May
