IF YOU WANT TO CLAIM:

100% ORGANIC OR ORGANIC



All indications apply to both labels and ingredient panels.

PRODUCT CONTENT

- If labeled as "Organic," must contain at least
 95% organic ingredients, excluding water and salt
- If labeled as "100% Organic," product must contain 100% organic ingredients, excluding water and salt. May not contain substances listed on Annex 1, Table 3, 4 or 5
- If labeled as "Organic," may contain up to 5% non-organic agricultural ingredients not available in organic form if they are listed on Annex 1, Table 3, 4 or 5. When not commercially available in organic form (these ingredients must be free of prohibited substances and methods) 1
- May not have any added sulfites

LABEL MUST

- Show the term "Organic" or "100% Organic" as applicable ²
- Show an ingredient statement
- Identify all organic ingredients as organic in the ingredient statement.
- Indicate the name & address of the final handler (importer, packer, processor, distributor, trader).
 Follow final hander information with a declaration such as "Certified Organic by Oregon Tilth" that indicates the name of the certification agent.
- Show the OTCO Client Identification number
- Include declaration, "Produced without GMO, GMO-Free or Non-GMO"
- Show the SENASICA Certifier Approval Code for OTCO OC-220622-22-CPAA-001

LABEL MAY

- Use the Mexico Organic National Emblem
- Show the commercial address website address or telephone number of the certifying agent
- Show the logo of the certification agent

LABEL MAY NOT

- Identify water and salt as organic ingredients.
- Use the the logo of the certifying agent to replace the required certified organic by statement.

UNDER THE MEXICO ORGANIC LAW





Upon approval from OTCO, the Mexico National Emblem may be used by OTCO certified operations on organic products produced within Mexico or in foreign territory and verified as complaint with the OTCO Mexico Compliance Program. Operators approved by Oregon Tilth to use the Mexico Organic Emblem should review the terms of use set forth in the applicable 2013 & 2021 Agreements*, which disclose the national organic products seal and the general rules established for its use in the labeling of products certified as organic.

In order to use the Mexico Organic National Emblem, the following provisions must be met:

- 1. The National Emblem must be used in the specific format and colors defined in Articles 3 10 of the 2021 Agreement, which discloses the national seal of organic products and the general rules established for its use in the labeling of products certified as organic.
- 2. The National Emblem should never appear as light colored or modified or distorted as a result of sizing or other graphic elements.
- 3. The National Emblem should occur in a visible location on the front or side panel of the package, followed by the statement "Certified Organic by Oregon Tilth."
- 4. If other national or private organic seals or logos are used, they may not be larger than the National Emblem.
- 5. Per Article 12 of the 2013 Agreement, all product labels or materials, which carry the National Emblem must be submitted to Oregon Tilth for prior authorization.
