



Instruction Organic Certification of Industrial Hemp Production

Links Updated: September 13, 2018

Purpose and scope

This instruction clarifies U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) policy regarding the organic certification of industrial hemp production by certifying agents accredited by the USDA National Organic Program (NOP). This instruction applies to all NOP-accredited certifying agents, and replaces the February 2016 version of NOP 2040.

2. Background

Section 7606 of the Agricultural Act of 2014 (Farm Bill) authorized institutions of higher education and state departments of agriculture to establish industrial hemp research pilot programs in states where the production of industrial hemp is legal and subject to certain other conditions. On August 12, 2016, the USDA, in consultation with the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, published a <u>Statement of Principles</u> on <u>Industrial Hemp</u> regarding the applicability of Federal laws to activities associated with growing and cultivating industrial hemp.

3. Policy

For hemp produced in the United States, only industrial hemp, produced in accordance with the 2014 Farm Bill, as articulated in the *Statement of Principles on Industrial Hemp* issued on August 12, 2016 by USDA, may be certified as organic, if produced in accordance with USDA organic regulations. USDA accredited certifiers should direct questions regarding the guidance to their Accreditation Manager. For imported hemp, existing regulations and guidelines continue to govern whether products may be certified as organic.

Title 7: Agriculture PART 205—NATIONAL ORGANIC PROGRAM Subpart C—Organic Production and Handling Requirements

§205.204 Seeds and planting stock practice standard.

(a) The producer must use organically grown seeds, annual seedlings, and planting stock: Except That,

(1) Nonorganically produced, untreated seeds and planting stock may be used to produce an organic crop when an equivalent organically produced variety is not commercially available: Except. That, organically produced seed must be used for the production of edible sprouts;

(2) Nonorganically produced seeds and planting stock that have been treated with a substance included on the National List of synthetic substances allowed for use in organic crop production may be used to produce an organic crop when an equivalent organically produced or untreated variety is not commercially available:

(3) Nonorganically produced annual seedlings may be used to produce an organic crop when a temporary variance has been granted in accordance with §205.290(a)(2):

(4) Nonorganically produced planting stock to be used to produce a perennial crop may be sold, labeled, or represented as organically produced only after the planting stock has been maintained under a system of organic management for a period of no less than 1 year; and

(5) Seeds, annual seedlings, and planting stock treated with prohibited substances may be used to produce an organic crop when the application of the materials is a requirement of Federal or State phytosanitary regulations.
 SECTION 3: Seeds and Seed Sources
 NOP Rule 205.204

 NOP Rule requires the use of certified organic seeds, unless the variety is not commercially available. If using nonorganic seeds, you must have records of your attempts to source organic seed. Synthetic seed treatments are, prohibited unless included on the National List. Genetically engineered/modified (GMO) seeds and inoculants are, prohibited in organic production. NOP Rule uses the phrase "excluded methods" to refer to GMO products. Please save all seed and inoculant labels, and documentation of commercial unavailability of organic seeds

to show the inspector.



Organic Hemp Policy

January 23, 2019

Overview:

Currently, KDA will certify hemp and hemp processors as organic. Our policy to become, organically certified for hemp production is as follows:

- Must be a license holder, and be in good standing with KDA's hemp program.
- KDA will certify the production of hemp for floral material extract (example CBD oil or full spectrum hemp extract).
- KDA will certify hemp seed/grain and hemp fiber production and processing.
- Seedlings must come from a certified organic greenhouse.
- KDA will not certify products marketed for animals (example: hemp floral material extract treats for dogs, hemp grain for poultry feed, hemp fiber for horse bedding), until such products are approved by the Association of American Feed Control Officials and/or the U.S. Food & Drug Administration
- For a hemp product to be certified organic, both the crop and the processor must be certified organic.
- Must use organic seeds, unless commercial unavailability is documented.
- Cuttings (hemp clones) must be organic, unless commercial unavailability is documented. o If commercial unavailability is determined, non-organic planting stock may be used. The non-organic planting stock (example: a mother plant) would be considered conventional, but anything added to the cutting after rooting must be approved for organic use and documented on the OSP for the cutting to be approved for organic production.
 - 2nd generation cuttings taken from the 1st generation cutting would then be considered organic planting stock.
- · Organic mother plants could also be obtained by starting from seed and using only organic approved inputs on the plant.
- Per guidance document 5029 4.3.3, feminized seeds would be allowed for use in organic production with a documented seed search.
 - o Producers who wish to collect their own feminized seeds would be allowed to do so. The products used to induce this process do not require review.
